Andreas E. Goutzioukostas was born in Chalkida in 1976. He graduated from the Department of History and Archaeology of the Faculty of Philosophy of the Aristotle University of Thessaloniki with a degree in History (grade: "Very Good 8,42"). In June 2000 he earned his master's degree in Byzantine History (grade: "Excellent 9,94") and in June 2004 he received his PhD degree in Byzantine History (grade: "Excellent") from the same Department. From September 2006 to May 2011 he served as a Lecturer of Byzantine History-Institutions at the Department of History and Archaeology and in June 2011 he was promoted to an Assistant Professor. In February 2018 he became an Associate Professor and since June 2022 he has been appointed as a Full Professor of Byzantine History-Institutions in the same Department. His research interests and publications focus on Byzantine institutions, the administration of justice, prosopography, Sigillography and Epigraphy.
