

Yannis Kalliontzis is Assistant Professor of Ancient History in the Department of History and Archaeology at the Aristotle University of Thessaloniki. He studied History and Archaeology at the University of Athens and pursued postgraduate studies in Ancient History and Epigraphy at Paris IV-Sorbonne. He received his PhD from the University of Neuchâtel and Paris IV-Sorbonne with a dissertation on the history and epigraphy of Hellenistic Boeotia.

He has served as an archaeologist at the Ephorate of Antiquities of Boeotia, as research assistant at the Collège de France, as member and researcher of the French School at Athens, and as researcher for the *Inscriptiones Graecae* of the Berlin-Brandenburg Academy of Sciences and Humanities. He has also held fellowships and research appointments at major international institutions, including the Center for Hellenic Studies of Harvard University, the Institute for Advanced Study in Princeton, and the Humboldt Foundation in Berlin. From 2021 to 2026, he was Assistant Professor at the Ionian University.

His research focuses on Greek epigraphy, the history of Boeotia, and the Hellenistic and Roman Greek world. He has published monographs, epigraphic corpora, and numerous articles in scholarly journals and edited volumes, and he is actively involved in the preparation of the new edition of the Boeotian inscriptions (*IG VII²*). He teaches undergraduate and postgraduate courses in ancient history and epigraphy and participates in international conferences and collaborative research projects.
